INTRODUCTION

Due to the recent amendment to the regulations of the Education Law, all individuals applying for a teaching certificate or license on or after February 2, 2007 in the areas of special education, speech and language disabilities, deaf and hard of hearing, blind and visually impaired, or school administrators and supervisors (assigned on or after September 2, 2009 to work as special education administrators prior to September 2, 2009), are required to obtain training in the area of autism spectrum disorders.

SLCD has been approved by NYSED to provide the mandated training course in the area of autism.

Although this is a mandated workshop for newly certified special education teachers and administrators; occupational therapists, physical therapists, speech and language pathologists, teachers assistants, teacher aides, respite workers, nurses and other medical professionals working in an educational facility with students on the autism spectrum, will find this workshop informative. This workshop is also designed to give parents a general overview of ASD and also to provide an informative approach to understanding the needs of students with autism spectrum disorders

Workshop Details

At the completion of the full length session(3hours), the participants will receive a Certificate of Completion which fulfills a certificate of attendance. The SED required form will be provided within 21 days of attendance of this workshop.
